Proposed Updates for KLH Constitution

At the upcoming KLH AGM, the following article changes will be discussed and voted on:

Article 4 a Board of Directors currently reads:

a) There shall be a Board of Directors consisting of a maximum of 15 members, 12 of whom are current or prospective volunteers elected from the membership at the Annual General Meeting with voting rights. Two additional board directors who are members in good standing with the Association and are between the age of 18 and 21 prior to January 1 of the current year shall hold the title of Youth Director and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting with voting rights. The past president shall also be a voting member of the Board.

Article 4 A would be changed to read: There shall be a Board of Directors consisting of a maximum of 10 current or prospective volunteers elected from the membership at the Annual General Meeting with voting rights. Two additional board directors who are members in good standing with the Association and are between the age of 18 and 21 prior to January 1 of the current year shall hold the title of Youth Director and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting with voting rights. The past president shall also be a voting member of the Board.

Article 4 G currently reads "At the first board of directors meeting following the Annual General Meeting, the board of directors, from amongst their members, shall elect a President, Vice President and Association Representative to the Ontario 4-H Council for a one-year term.

Article 4 G would be changed to read "At the first board of directors meeting following the Annual General Meeting the board of directors, from amongst their members, shall elect a President and Vice President for a one-year term.

The Association Representative to the Ontario 4-H council is a one-year position. The election for this position will take place no later than October 31 of the current year. Only those elected to the board members who will not be retiring from the board of directors at the following Annual General Meeting will be able to let their name stand for election for the position of Association Representative to the Ontario 4-H Council.

EAST CENTRAL FARM SHOW FOOD BOOTH

East Central Crop and Soil Assoc. has confirmed, that KLH 4-H Assoc. will be operating the food booth at the east Central Farm Show **Mar 6 and 7**th at the Lindsay Exhibition.

We are requesting assistance from the 4-H Clubs, leaders, members, family members and friends of 4-H, as it takes 12 people per day, per hour, to provide this service.

Leaders are asked to contact their members and seek this help.

NOTE: Clover Buds participating – if an adult or older family member could come with the member, it would be appreciated.

In order to receive funds from the food booth for your club(s), from the food booth, a "minimum" of 4 people for a "minimum" of three hours each must volunteer for each club. They are to sign in and sign out, indicating the times, and the 4-H Club.

Also: to receive funds from both the food booth and the carts, a minimum of 21 hours of volunteering is required.

Additional Funds from the Coffee Carts are also available.

- Priority will be given to NEW clubs starting after Round Up. A letter must be submitted by April 15th from the Club stating what the funds will be used for. Leaders, members, family members or friends, must participate in the food booth or with the food carts.
- 2. Existing Clubs requesting funds, in addition to the funds, that may be received from the food booth, may also request in writing, by March 15th, stating what the funds will be used for. Note: priority will be given to New Clubs.

NOTE: A minimum of 3 people must sign in for a minimum of 3 hours each. They are to sign in and sign out indicating the times and the 4-H Club.
