# **East Central Championship Show Updates**

New for 2018, the Lindsay Exhibition implementing a new pass/gate admission system for the LEX. All 4-H members participating in the ECCS on Wed. Sept 19<sup>th</sup> will be asked to show their 2018 membership card at the gate in order to enter the barn area. When you register for the show, you will receive a wristband which you **MUST** wear the entire day!!!! If you are not a 4-H member participating in the show, you will be asked to pay admission to the LEX. Truckers dropping off animals will be allowed to unload and leave the grounds. If they choose to stay on the LEX grounds, they will also be asked to pay admission. Please respect the implementation of the new gate admission system and wear your wristband upon payment at the gate.

## **Dress Code for Livestock Shows**

**Policy:** Kawartha Lakes Haliburton 4-H members showing livestock must adhere to the below list of acceptable attire for the various types of livestock. When a show dictates or provides different attire it is acceptable for members to wear the attire provided.

**Dairy:** White pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirts with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures, adequate footwear

**Beef:** Black pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirt with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures, adequate footwear.

**Lamb:** Black pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirt with a collar and sleeves and, and no advertising, writing or pictures adequate footwear,

**Horses:** Varies depending on the breed or discipline. Standard attire is dark pants or breeches and a clean shirt with a collar and sleeve and no advertising, writing or pictures.

**Dairy Goats:** White pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirts with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures, adequate footwear

**Meat Goats:** Black pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirt with a collar and sleeves, and no advertising, writing or pictures equate footwear.

**Swine:** Dark pants (dress pants and jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirts with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures, adequate footwear.

**Rabbits:** White pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirts with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures or white lab coat.

**Poultry:** White pants (dress pants or jeans only, no tights, yoga pants or stretch pants), white shirts with a collar and sleeves and no advertising, writing or pictures or white lab coat.

It is the member's responsibility to ensure they comply with the above listed guidelines and that all attire is kept as clean and neat as possible.
