

Livestock Co-ordinator

Kawartha Lakes Haliburton 4-H Association is looking to fill the position of Livestock Co-ordinator. This person will work closely with the livestock club volunteers and the KLH 4-H board of directors to ensure all policies and procedures are followed. Livestock Contact Job Description:

- This position will maintain voting rights IF the individual is also an elected member of the board of directors
- This position will be reviewed annually by the board of directors at the final meeting of the year before the AGM, for reappointment for the following year
- Will be provided with login information and a handbook for the 4H Ontario AssitExpo Database by 4H Ontario
- Must remind association members/volunteers that the provincial deadline for electronic PAIF submission is no later than June 1st
- Responsible for reviewing the electronic PAIF for Association to verify that members are 4H members in good standing by June 10th. Refer to Livestock Contact handbook for details

Responsibilities:

- Distribute electronic PAIF information to their 4H livestock volunteers
- Communicate who the designated local livestock contact is
- Communicate local deadline for electronic submission of PAIF to livestock club members and volunteers
- Ensure accuracy of entries and eligibility of livestock members in inter-county competitions
- Contact person for all livestock related matters
- Communicate with livestock leaders to receive accurate information for achievement day results and 4H Fair results
- Communicate with Activity Coordinator for program for 4H Fair and for Breed Awards for awards night
- Should be on the 4H fair committee and East Central committee

Requirements:

- Must be a screened volunteer
- Must have regular access to internet
- Awareness of 4-H Ontario Policies
- Must be familiar with 4H Ontario and KLH policies and procedures regarding all livestock matters
- Should have a strong agriculture background
- May be appointed by the elected board of directors from the general membership or from the current board of directors
- Ability to communicate effectively to the association membership, the executive committee and the Ontario 4-H council

In preparation for the KLH Awards Program, nominations are being called for the following awards:

- **Outstanding Agriculture Member: sponsored by the Ontario Plowmen's Association.** This award is presented to an outstanding agricultural member. Please note in your nomination the member's name and reason why you believe them to be outstanding in the area of agriculture 4-H.

- **KLH Just Because Award:** 4-H provides a program that can be adapted to the needs of each participant or leader. For this reason, our youth join "Just Because". Each member is unique- their personality, their strengths, their weaknesses, and the challenges they encounter "Just Because" that is who they are. The KLH 4-H Association wants to recognize them for their efforts to achieve their personal best, for their desire to participate and for challenging themselves and inspiring others "Just Because". Club Leaders are asked to submit a short one page nomination including the members name and an example of how this member works to achieve their personal best through participation and inspiration.

- **4-H Leadership Awards: sponsored by TD Canada Trust.** The 4-H Leadership Award is presented annually to senior 4-H member(s) in KLH. Award criteria includes: completion of a minimum four years in 4-H, completion of at least 12 projects and a minimum of 16 years of age. Selection is made by a volunteer committee and based on member interest, participation and leadership in the 4-H program. In the nomination include the members name and how the member has shown interest and demonstrated participation and leadership in the 4-H program.

- **Kawartha Lakes Haliburton 4-H Volunteer of the Year Award:** This award is presented annually to an individual (i.e. club leader, volunteer at large including event volunteers, parents,) who consistently exhibits an interest in 4-H and displays the qualities of kindness, patience, perseverance, diplomacy and untiring effort. When submitting the nomination please note the volunteer's name and examples of how they have displayed the qualities noted in the award criteria.

Exact location yet to be determined - will be in Fenelon Fall/Cambray area.


You will learn basic sewing techniques and basic sewing machine operation. There may be extra cost involved in this club beyond regular 4-H membership fee.
