How do I fill out the Project Animal Identification Form (PAIF)?

- First read over the form completely.
- Ask your 4-H leader or parent to help you, if you have any questions.
- Use blue or black ink pen- No pencil, marker, gel pen, or red ink pen.
- Print only – do not write. Be sure all information is legible.
- Fill out each line completely. If a line doesn't apply to you, write "n/a" (not applicable).
- After you're done, read over your form, make sure that each line has been completed and sign the form.
- Ensure the proper identification information for the commodity being shown is included on the form or your form will not be accepted. Beef PAIF must include a CCIA tag number, Dairy PAIF must include a Registration #/EZE-IR Tag number, Swine PAIF must include a PigTrace number and Lamb PAIF must include a CSI tag number.
- Have your 4-H leader read your form to make sure it is complete and then sign it.
- Hand in your completed form to your 4-H leader by the date set by your leader or local 4-H livestock contact (prior to June 1st). Note: Your local 4-H Association may have a policy that you must submit your form by the local county deadline in order to be eligible. To find out, ask your leader or contact your local 4H Association.
- If you miss the county deadline or the deadline that your 4-H leader set and you intend to show at multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events, you are responsible for ensuring that your form is delivered by June 1st to the Coordinator, Programming & Livestock.
- Forms received after June 1st are late, and those members will not be eligible to participate in multi-county, regional, provincial or national 4-H livestock events.
- If the PAIF form is faxed, the original must be received by Coordinator, Programming & Livestock within seven business days of June 1st.

FORM MUST BE COMPLETED IN FULL AND BE LEGIBLE IN ORDER TO BE VALID.

4-H Ontario Livestock Policy:

- In order for 4-H members to be eligible to participate in multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events, the original signed copy of the Project Animal Identification Form must be received by the Coordinator, Programming & Livestock no later than June 1st of the current calendar year.
- 4-H members are allowed to have only ONE animal per commodity designated on the 4-H Project Animal Identification Form to be eligible for multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events. In addition to 4-H Ontario policies, 4-H members must follow the rules and regulations as outlined by the shows in which they are participating.
- Only the animal that is properly identified as the 4-H project on the Project Animal Identification Form shall be eligible to enter multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events.
- There shall be absolutely no substitution of animals designated on the Project Animal Identification Form for any reason for multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events.
- In order for 4-H members to be eligible to participate in multi-county, regional, provincial and/or national 4-H livestock events, the member must be a paid / provincially registered member by June 1st of the current calendar year.
